



Mass of the Last Supper

OPENING HYMN: I AM THE BREAD OF LIFE

1. I am the Bread of life. You who come to me shall not hunger; and who believe in me shall not thirst. No one can come to me unless the Father beckons.

Refrain: And I will raise you up, and I will raise you up,
and I will raise you up on the last day.

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father.

Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world; receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us.

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

THE WASHING OF FEET: AS I HAVE DONE FOR YOU

Refrain: I, your Lord and Master, now become your servant.

I who made the moon and stars will kneel and wash your feet.

This is my commandment: to love as I have loved you.

Kneel to wash each other's feet as I have done for you.

But the tears of your sorrow will soon turn to joy.
As a mother cries in childbirth and her pain is turned to gladness,
you will know great rejoicing on the day of my return. *(Refrain)*
6. I will give you peace; this will be my blessing.
Though the world churns around you, I leave you my peace.
I have told you all these things that my peace may dwell within you.
Let your faith be unshaken and your hope be ever strong. *(Refrain)*
